Showing intention

E.g. I have decided what to do next. I am going to visit Disneyland.

Present Simple



Scheduled events

E.g. The library opens at 9 am next Monday.

Present Continuous



Planned actions / arrangements

E.g. Tom is taking the English exam next week. She has bought some exercises to help with his revision.
